On November 26, 2024, CSIR-CBRI, Roorkee, organized the Valedictory function to mark the culmination of the Janjatiya Gaurav Divas celebrations. The event witnessed the active participation of around 100 students from Sheffield School, Piran Kaliyar, and Government Secondary Schools, Muzaffarnagar, along their faculty members. Dr. S. Maiti inaugurated the event with a brief and insightful introduction to Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas.

The event commenced with an inspiring inaugural address by the Prof. R. Pradeep Kumar, Director, CSIR-CBRI setting the tone for the celebrations and emphasizing the importance of the event. The Director emphasized the importance of understanding humanity and cultivating three essential values: integrity, character, and morality, which define us as good human beings.
